
Pursuant to our telephone conversation on February 8, 2010, please find enclosed an Internet Transmission Request Application for transmitting your recorded production on the internet via RePAC's Virtual Public Channel website. RePAC's website is accessible at www.repac9.org. The purpose of the application is to secure information concerning proof of intellectual property ownership and content suitability of your recorded production.

Although Comcast Corporation/Comcast Cable had allocated the cable Public Access Channel for RePAC's use in April 2004, the Town of Rehoboth Board of Selectmen have refused to formally request the activation of this channel for public use, which would have included your recorded production. RePAC has repeatedly reminded the Board of Selectmen that a written notification to Comcast Corporation/Comcast Cable is necessary for the activation of the Public Access Channel but our gentle reminders appear to have been ignored.

Thus, once the Rehoboth Board of Selectmen decide to request the activation of the cable Public Access Channel, the recorded programs that are produced by the public, including your programs, can be transmitted in the future to cable subscribers in the Town of Rehoboth. Until then, RePAC has made available its website to transmit public programs over the internet.
