Re.: Board of Selectmen Public Meeting January 25, 2010; Contract Renegotiation with Comcast Corporation.


Messrs. Vadnais and McBride:

It is my understanding that, at the January 25, 2010, Board of Selectmen public meeting, Mr. McBride moved to renegotiate the March 29, 2004, Comcast Cable Television Renewal License contract ("contract"). Mr. Vadnais seconded said motion. Mr. K. Foley twice queried you concerning the exact nature and basis of said renegotiation. Mr. Vadnais and Mr. McBride ignored Mr. Foley's questions and refused to provide the public the underlying reasons for such proposed renegotiation. Mr. Vadnais and Mr. McBride then voted to affirm the renegotiation and Mr. Foley opposed.

During the past six (6) months, you received numerous written instructions from RePAC concerning Comcast's formality necessary to activate the Public Access Channel so that it can be integrated with RePAC's operational Government Access Channel 9 and Educational Access Channel 15. Instead, you chose to ignore Comcast's contract terms.

Please be reminded that RePAC is a third-party beneficiary under the terms of said contract. In light of RePAC's contractual legal interest, your ongoing full disclosure to RePAC appears to be necessary and appropriate. I urge you to avoid the uncomfortable circumstances of creating a municipal government culture founded on the shaky props of secrecy. RePAC always seeks good faith dealings and fair play practices in engaging public issues and expects the same from the Board of Selectmen concerning the proposed renegotiations of the contract.
