
On November 9, 2011, Mr. Ritter caused to publish a set of documents purporting to be supporting Board of Selectmen's allegations of contract breaches by RePAC, including a report compiled by Sgt. Mark Rossi ("Rossi") of the Town of Rehoboth ("Rehoboth") Police Department which lists the Date of Birth (DOB), the Social Security Number (SSN), and telephone numbers of the following persons:

On November 10, 2011, RePAC received a facsimile transmission from Ritter's office requesting the cablecasting on Channel 9 bulletin board that "Documents supporting (sic) the Board of Selectmen's September 12, 2011 vote to investigate possible breaches by the Access Corporation of its Agreement (sic) with the Selectmen are on file and available for public inspection at the Office of the Town Clerk during regular business hours and are available for copying at the usual per page rate." Aside from several spelling errors, which would in itself exclude the notice from being cablecasted, the publication of Rossi's report of private matters presents a more serious issue.

Recall that Section 6.9 of the Cable Television Renewal License between Rehoboth and Comcast ("License"), effective April 10, 2004, mandates that **the editorial discretion and the content of programming on the three Public Access Channels, and any liability therefore, shall reside solely with, and be the sole responsibility of, RePAC.** Thus, RePAC respectfully declines to cablecast said notice so that RePAC's liability for its content and programming, related to the improper incursions into the expectations of privacy, can be avoided.
