SUBJECT: Agreement Between the Town of Rehoboth and Rehoboth Public Access Corporation, Inc.

Dear Mr. Breault:

The Board of Selectmen would like to invite you and members of your Board to meet with them on Monday June 13, 2011 at 6:00p.m. at the Rehoboth Senior Center, 55 Bay State Road.

The purpose of this Executive Session meeting is to discuss several clarifications to the provisions of the mutually negotiated "Agreement by and Between the Town of Rehoboth and the Rehoboth Public Access Corporation, Inc." dated April 3, 2008. If necessary, the Board is prepared to negotiate amendments to the current Agreement which the Board believes will enhance coverage and service to the citizens of Rehoboth.

Specifically, but not limited to, the Board would like to have the opportunity to discuss with your Board the following:

- All meetings are to be broadcast live and unedited. RePAC is at all times to be a neutral Agent of the Town; and live broadcast decisions will be based upon important public policy concerns only; the Selectmen expect RePac to broadcast live as many public meetings as possible. To ensure transparency and impartially for the citizens of Rehoboth the Selectmen would like to be reassured that all cablecasts of public meetings, live or otherwise are not edited.
- The Selectmen want to ensure that RePac is a vibrant and impartial community organization where an environment of volunteerism and service is nurtured and public participation is open to all, is encouraged. The Selectmen would like to discuss ensuring that Public, Educational and Governmental Access services to the citizens of Rehoboth are delivered in a manner that is neutral, transparent, and accessible to all. This includes equal access for all citizens of Rehoboth to membership and voice in the Access organization.
- The Selectmen are seeking a closer and more responsive partnership with RePAC and to open the lines of communication so as to enhance the current framework of a working

relationship. Simply stated, the Selectmen want establish a new relationship that will serve all the citizens of Rehoboth in a manner that reflects a dedication to impartial, and responsible public service, through an organization that is accessible to all and responsive to public needs.
